The Lorain Police Charities received \$3,000.46 for the Cops and Kids program from the Fraternal Order of Police (FOPA) No. 46. "In the past, we've always donated \$3,000 and the 46 cents represents us as lodge 46," said Committee Member Cynthia Theodorapoulos.

The funds were generated from the FOPA's first Chili Cook-off, which took place in November. "So often, volunteers come in and they don't get much more recognition than a simple 'thank you,' but we wanted to add a personal touch with the aprons," Theodorapoulos said. "We want them to be able to boast that they participated, and hopefully, spark some discussion around our organization." The check was presented Dec. 8 at Lorain City Hall, 200 W. Erie Ave. Lorain police officers will take those qualified for the program Christmas shopping Dec. 10.

Jim Malick, president of FOPA No. 46, said the group is grateful for everyone who helped make the fundraiser a success, especially major sponsors Mayor Jack Bradley and state Sen. Nathan Manning as well as Lorain's business community. "It's a huge support and great to see people involved in the community from that standpoint," Theodorapoulos said. "The Chili Cook-off was a brand new event, so it was amazing to see their confidence in us and their willingness to give." The organization will continue to prioritize community engagement, she said.

"There are more child community programs that we would like to establish and be able to give more," Theodorapoulos said. "A lot of meetings and gatherings were on pause during COVID, but we're now trying to rebuild our organization and also draw younger members to pass the torch to a younger generation."

Theodorapoulos, who joined the organization a year ago, said she hopes to inspire others to get involved. "I was approached and in the position to get involved, but I think it's important to give back and support the police," she said. "We want to create camaraderie between the community and police officers because there are good cops, and it's important that they get support from us."

During the course of their investigation, these investigators were able to identify the suspects, as well as additional juvenile victims. The case concluded in July of this year when the suspects were convicted of a total of 19 felony counts of Rape and Gross Sexual Imposition. Two of the suspects are now serving life sentences and the third is serving a three-year sentence. Congratulations and thank you for your hard work!

The November FOPA #4 meeting was held on Tuesday, November 1st. Congratulations to Sgt. Bradley White, PO James Ball, PO Jason O'Brien and PO Samuel Giver. Officer Giver responded for a suicidal man holding a firearm to his head. PO Giver and his fellow officers negotiated with man until he surrendered the firearm to the police. Congratulations and thank you for your hard work!

The December FOPA #4 meeting was held on Tuesday December 6. Fire Lieutenant Fidel Akemon was honored for saving the life of Police Recruit John Brown. Fire Lieutenant Akemon was nominated by CPD Captain Aaron Jones for, "The quick and decisive actions he took on January 17, 2021, when Recruit Brown suffered a lifethreatening medical emergency during a training scenario". Lt. Akemon immediately rendered necessary first aid measures to Recruit Brown and was able to contact the Cincinnati Fire Department directly with critical information, thus reducing response time and allowing for quicker application of advanced life-saving measures by responding paramedics, as well as quicker transport to University Hospital. Thank you, Fire Lieutenant Akemon, for your quick actions that resulted in an expedited response by paramedics, quick hospital transport, and thus saved Recruit Brown's life!


