

Member Spotlight

A Lifetime of Service: The Law Enforcement and FOPA Leadership of Mark Hoageson

For 35 years, Mark Hoageson served the City of Richmond Heights as a dedicated member of the Auxiliary Police Unit, retiring on April 8, 2024 after more than two decades as unit commander. Known for his steady leadership, calm presence, and genuine care for the community, Mark built a reputation as someone who always put people first. His colleagues describe him as a deeply committed public servant who consistently went above and beyond to support the safety and well-being of his hometown.

Mark's approach to policing was rooted in connection. He believed that trust was earned through visibility, kindness, and meaningful engagement. Whether assisting patrol officers during major incidents, supporting city events, or conducting routine preventive patrols, he understood the unique role auxiliary officers play in strengthening the bond between residents and the police department.

Some of Mark's most memorable contributions came from the joy he brought to local families. He became known for decorating police cruisers for Christmas, Easter, and Halloween, driving through neighborhoods with holiday music playing from the loudspeakers. Children would run out to wave, laugh, and—on Halloween—collect candy directly from the cruiser. Those moments of fun and community spirit reflected Mark's belief that policing is not only about safety, but also about building positive experiences that last.

Throughout his career, Mark volunteered countless hours to support the city during water main breaks, power outages, parades, concerts, and weekend park patrols. At a time when many departments faced staffing challenges, his leadership ensured that Richmond Heights continued to benefit from high-visibility preventive patrols, both mobile and on foot. His dedication made him a living example of modern community policing.



Service Beyond the Badge: Leadership in FOPA Lodge #27

Mark's commitment to public service extends far beyond his work in uniform. A member of FOPA Eastern Cuyahoga Lodge #27 since 1989, he has served as Treasurer for the past five years—guiding the lodge through one of the most challenging periods in its history.

Coming out of the COVID-19 pandemic, the lodge faced significant financial and organizational pressures. Membership was aging, participation had declined, and long-standing revenue sources were no longer reliable. Under Mark's steady financial leadership, Lodge #27 undertook a series of necessary reforms to stabilize operations, align spending with available resources, and chart a sustainable path forward. His approach was practical, transparent, and focused on preserving the lodge's mission while adapting to new realities.

Mark also stepped up as Newsletter Editor, ensuring that members remained informed, connected, and engaged during a time when communication was more important than ever. His work helped maintain continuity, strengthen relationships, and support the lodge's recovery and growth.

Today, Mark continues to serve actively in both roles—Treasurer and Newsletter Editor—demonstrating the same dedication and reliability that defined his law-enforcement career.

Continuing Service to the Community

Even in retirement from the Auxiliary Unit, Mark remains connected to the Richmond Heights Police Department. He continues to assist the department during special events and on particular occasions when his experience and steady presence are needed. His commitment to service has never been tied to a title; it is simply who he is.

A Legacy of Leadership and Community

From decades of community-focused policing to guiding FOPA Lodge #27 through a period of transformation, Mark Hoageson has built a legacy defined by service, integrity, and genuine care for others. His impact is felt in the officers he mentored, the residents he connected with, the lodge he helped stabilize, and the countless moments of kindness he created along the way.

His story is a reminder that leadership is not measured only in rank or years served, but in the lives touched and the community strengthened.
