#### Updates

This year has definitely changed with the way the State Lodge conducts business as well. And last week it was announced that our yearly FOP/FOPA State Conference which was to be held in Sandusky has been cancelled as well. The FOP is working on options for virtual meetings for their state conference, and we will look into that as well.

One thing that still must be done, even if you aren't currently meeting, is filing your taxes. We can't stress how important it is to keep your status current with the IRS. Most lodges file electronically, it's a simple procedure but please make sure it gets done. Lodge officers, check with each other and make sure your lodge has filed. #### Around the State

#### City of Fairfield Lodge 97

The City of Fairfield Fraternal Order of Police Associates Lodge 97 (FOPA Lodge 97) winds up another year of successful community service projects. A big portion of the FOPA goals is community service where the FOPA Lodge 97 selects an organization and members donate to the needs of that organization.

In January and February of 2020, Fairfield FOPA members brought in over 400 food items as part of a Food Challenge between the City of Fairfield Police and Fire Departments. Member generosity helped the local food pantry supply food items for needy families within the City of Fairfield community.

The Fraternal Order of Police Associates were unable to have in-person meetings since COVID; however, member communications continued through FOPA email weekly news updates.

2020 community service Christmas projects were two-fold. First Step Home is a facility for women in various stages of recovery from addiction. This year FOPA Lodge 97 partnered with City of Fairfield Fraternal Order of Police members to help meet the needs of First Step Home. Collected were 136 pairs of socks, 33 toothbrushes, 14 toothpaste, 77 lotions, 55 deodorants, 2 hair conditioners, 13 shampoos, 5 scarves, 20 hand soaps, 5 blankets, 2 (\$25 each) Target gift cards and 4 (\$25 each) Kroger gift cards. Gift cards will help to purchase needed personal items.

The second 2020 Christmas project was for Women Helping Women who requested soap and items for babies in the care of mothers. Donated to Women Helping Women were 631 diapers, 1728 baby wipes, 74 bars of soap, 2 (\$25) Target gift cards and 4 (\$25) Kroger gift cards. The Target and Kroger gift cards will help with needed items.

Without the support of Fraternal Order of Police Associates members and help from the City of Fairfield Fraternal Order of Police, the community service projects would not be possible. The Fraternal Order of Police Associates is small in membership; however, the outpouring of generosity of its members is extraordinary.

### Ohio Line of Duty Death

#### Ofc. Brandon M. Stalker

The Toledo Police Department memorialized one of its own Tuesday. Officer Brandon M. Stalker was shot and killed in the line of duty Monday January 18, 2021. The 24 year old had been a TPD officer since March 2, 2019.

Officer Stalker's funeral was held at John F. Savage Arena on the University of Toledo main campus. The funeral commenced at 10 a.m. with law enforcement officers from around the state and region attending. Also in attendance were Congresswoman Marcy Kaptur and Toledo Mayor Wade Kapszukiewicz.

"I prayed to God that I would never stand on this stage again, that my police department would never endure this pain and shock again, prayed that another TPD family would never have to experience the tragic loss of a loved one" said TPD Chief George Kral.

Officer Stalker attended the police academy with Officer Anthony Dia who was killed in the line of duty July 4, 2020 by a gunman.

Following the funeral, a procession including over 300 law enforcement vehicles escorted Officer Stalker's casket to Toledo Memorial Park in Sylvania. The graveside service was private, open only to family, friends, and law enforcement.

Among the departments sending officers to the funeral were Sandusky PD, Port Clinton PD, Norwalk PD, Marblehead PD, Lakewood PD, East Cleveland PD, OSU PD, Pro Medica Security, Columbus PD, Taylor (MI) PD, Sylvania PD, United States Border Patrol, Ohio State Highway Patrol, Northwood PD, numerous Sheriff's departments, and many, many others. The Columbus police and Cleveland Metroparks Police sent their mounted units.

Officer Stalker leaves behind his fiancée, Ashley Ohmer and his children Kennah Miller-Stalker and Grayson Stalker. Officer Stalker is also survived by his parents, David and Cosette, Grandparents William Lowe and Barbara Grover, brothers, sisters, a niece and a nephew. Anyone wishing to make a memorial contribution may donate to the Brandon Stalker fund at Toledo Police Federal Credit Union.
